

## After The Market Drop: Investment Ideas for a Long-Term Portfolio

n order to get a broad view of the investment landscape and possible opportunities, one must first take a hard look at where both the United States and world economies are heading. At time of writing (June 12) one could argue that the current global economic downturn is the worse since World War 2 and possibly since the Great Depression. Many of the economic headlines over the past several months have been downright scary.

United States unemployment in May jumped to 9.4 percent, the worst in 35 years, with many analysts predicting the figure to rise to 11 percent. The United States housing market, which many blame as the culprit of the economic demise, is still in shambles. As measured by the Case-Shiller Index, the year-over-year average price of a home in the United States decline by a record percent in the first quarter of 2009. Individuals filing for foreclosure are up an astounding percent from May 2008.

The price of oil has more than doubled since March, more in part due to hopes for an economic rebound than a pure supply/demand situation. This is clearly reflected in gasoline prices that have also risen substantially, which could potentially pull millions of dollars from consumer's pockets, which could otherwise assist with a modest recovery in consumer spending.

Interest rates as reflected in treasury bond yields have risen dramatically over the past couple of weeks. Rising interest rates are feared by those who believe higher rates could thwart economic health. Thirty-year mortgage rates have followed suit, spiking almost a full percentage point over the past month. Higher mortgage rates could potentially curtail home purchases and further derail any housing market recovery.

Although it is clear that the global economy is still in a pronounced downturn, recent economic data is suggesting that things are still "getting worse, but at a declining rate". Several pieces of data have touched off tidbits of economic hope. For example, United States employer's "only" cut

345,000 jobs from their payrolls in May, which was roughly a third less than economist's had expected, given that job losses have been twice that for the past six months.

Improvement in many emerging markets is also encouraging. Chinese industrial production has started to recover, and imports of commodities have risen, while car sales in India and retail sales in Brazil are also on the rise. The Reserve Bank of India expects its economy to grow 6 percent this fiscal year.

By analyzing this economic data, one can see several potential long-term investment opportunities. First, although the current economic situation is quite dire, the consent among Wall Street analysts and economists is that an economic recovery is on its way, possibly by the end of this year. When the recovery does materialize, economies of developing markets are likely to lead the way.

Second, as the United States dollar continues to weaken with a global economic upturn, United States companies with strong international exposure (especially to commodities) should fare well. For example, mining equipment manufacturer Bucyrus, explosion welder Dynamic Materials and technology leader Apple all have international sales and could see strong performance as their foreign profits are translated into United States dollars.

Third, although the United States housing market is showing little if no signs of life, the sector could be poised for generous returns when the housing market rebounds. A broad-based exchange traded fund, such as the Dow Jones iShares Home Construction Index, could provide investor's the opportunity to get in on the ground floor of a sector which has been all but obliterated over the past couple of years.


